Asia Pacific Political Science Research and Publication Conference Bangkok, Thailand | July 21 – July 23, 2022

Building on the success of APSA's [Asia Workshops program](#), this program will bring together early-career scholars from across East and Southeast Asia for networking and research feedback. Organized in collaboration with Thammasat and Chulalongkorn Universities and held alongside the Southeast Asia Research Group (SEAREG) Summer Conference, this gathering of approximately 70 scholars is an opportunity to engage with colleagues from across the Asia Pacific region and contribute to contemporary debates in the discipline.
