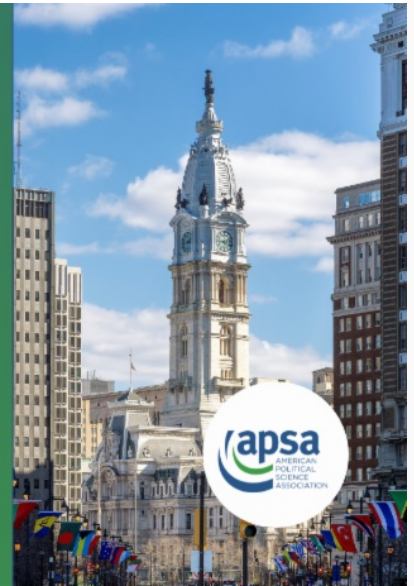

Thursday, September 5 | 4:00 p.m. to 5:30 p.m.

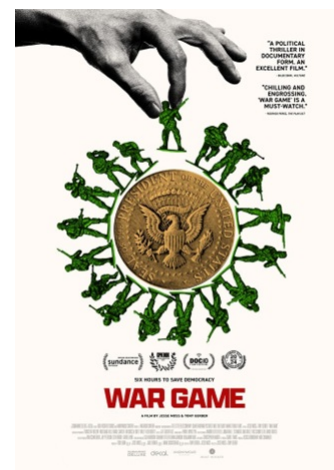

War Game is a real-life political thriller set on January 6, 2025, *War Game* imagines a nation-wide insurrection in which members of the US military defect to support the losing Presidential candidate, while the winning candidate and his advisors—played by an all-star roster of senior officials from the last five administrations—war games the crisis in the White House situation room. They have 6 hours to save democracy as the country teeters on the brink of civil war. 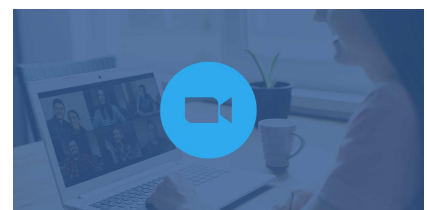

► Funding Opportunities for Graduate Student Members

APSA Graduate Support Fund Open October 1st

The APSA Committee on the Status of Graduate Students has launched a [support fund to help students](#) with unexpected, emergency costs. This fund has a quarterly allocation cycle. The October 2024 support fund application process will run as a lottery system. There is no review process—this fund is for graduate student members of APSA and all applications are eligible if certain conditions are met (being registered as a graduate student member of APSA).



Applications will open October 1, 2024 at 8:00 a.m., and close at October 8, 2024 5:00 p.m. EST.

After applications have closed, all applications will receive a number. APSA staff will then use a random number generator to select the maximum number of applications to be funded. We anticipate that we will be able to fully fund 8 applications for the October 2024 cycle. Those who are not part of the applications randomly selected to be funded will be eligible to reapply for funding in 2025. For more information about the fund, please visit our website.
