

**CALL FOR EDITOR:**  
***Journal of Experimental Political Science***

The [Journal of Experimental Political Science](#) is entering its second decade. Current editors, Scott Clifford, Texas A & M University, and Jennifer Jerit, Dartmouth College, will end their term on December 31, 2026.

The APSA Experimental Research Section Chair, Ariel White, has named a search committee to identify and appoint a successor editor or team of editors. A new editor (or team of editors) will be named in June of 2026 to a four-year term. The new four-year term will begin on January 1, 2027. Editors may elect to renew their four-year term once, for a combined term of eight years.

The members of the search committee are Lynn Vavreck, UCLA, Chair; Jamie Druckman, University of Rochester; Costas Panagopoulos, Northeastern University; and Ariel White, MIT.

Now in its eleventh year, the goal of *JEPS* is to present excellent work in experimental political science to political scientists and other social scientists, as well as to interested parties in foundations, government, and the private sector. The journal currently publishes three digital editions annually.

The search committee invites proposals for an editor or team of editors to lead the journal. The new editor or editors will be charged with upholding the high standards of excellence cultivated by previous editors. **The search committee seeks an editor or editorial team with a commitment to publishing articles that represent the substantive and methodological diversity of experimental work in the discipline.** The section is also interested in proposals that include innovative ideas for manuscript cultivation, review, and publication; as well as innovations about the structure and format of articles printed in the journal.

Typically, the editorial home institution and the publisher share the cost of running the journal. Potential editors should consider this in submitting proposals to the committee.

We encourage potential editors or editorial teams to showcase their imaginations as they develop a vision for the future of *JEPS*. The search committee welcomes preliminary conversations with potential editors or editorial teams who wish to discuss ideas before submitting a proposal.

The editor(s) is/are responsible for managing and administering the day-to-day operations of the journal; including selecting, appointing, and managing the editorial board, and any associate editors; and presenting an annual report to the American Political Science Association's (APSA) Experimental Research Section that includes data on submissions, acceptances/rejections, speed of decisions, and any other pertinent information. The editor is also supported by a Journal

Advisory Committee and Journal Standards Committee, the members of each of which are appointed by the Experimental Research Section Chair.

Proposals of roughly 3 pages should be sent to Lynn Vavreck at [vavreck@mac.com](mailto:vavreck@mac.com). Proposals should detail a comprehensive vision for the journal, describe the administrative or editorial experience of the principal(s), discuss an organizational plan for journal work, explain the proposed institutional support from the home institution including the availability of office space, financial subsidies, faculty release time, student or staff assistance or other material support. Proposals should be accompanied by CVs of primary editors.

The committee will begin to review proposals on April 15, 2026. Only proposals submitted on or before April 15, 2026 are guaranteed to receive full consideration. The committee may opt to review proposals submitted after the deadline at the discretion of the section chair in consultation with the committee.
